**Karl Rubli** presented an exciting exhibition of wood sculptures for our first members' exhibition of the year.

While Karl studied engineering in Switzerland as a young man, he also visited art schools, and both styling and design became part of his busy life. His favoured medium of wood carving became a major hobby following his retirement. His stylized forms begin their existence in his sketchbook and his mind and thence into the beautiful and simplified forms he loves and that Ferry Park Gallery has been privileged to host.

## **Artist of the Month February:**

Diane Valerie Nixon (aka DivaNix) presents her unique and eclectic wearable art jewellery and fashion pieces at Ferry Park Gallery this month. Di's jewellery is hand-crafted using gems, glass and pearls on string, wire, leather and whatever comes to hand, producing distinctive designs. Asymmetrical features are characteristic of her work.

Di also hand dyes silk to create one-off scarves and wraps and has added another dimension to her botanical dyed silk using fine merino wool. These award-winning pieces are richly coloured, luxuriously soft, stylish and collectable.

Her eclectic nature makes her an op-shop tragic.



She sources quality pre-loved, vintage and contemporary clothing and textiles which she strings and wraps with Japanese Shibori techniques, then dyeing them in indigo. This range includes women's, men's, baby wear and exquisite table linens. Come into the gallery to see the DivaNix range of delights this month.
