From V-P Bobbie Winger's opening remarks (October 14)

Bobbie reported that new shelving has been delayed and there was a reexamining of the repairs to the jewellery cabinet. The review of artists' mediums has taken place and exhibitors have been contacted if there had been a need.

While Bobbie's opening report was succinct, there were other issues during the meeting that brought much discussion, especially that of the possibility of an Electric Vehicle charger in the gallery carpark. After a great deal of research, Bobbie advised that the cost to LCACA would be about \$8000 after receiving the grant (application to be completed by end of October, with another round available in 2023). After much discussion it was felt that the recovery of money after investment was not economically viable and the decision to apply for a grant was put on hold until the next round of grants becomes available.

In a related climate-aware matter, Bobbie will investigate the cost of fitting the gallery with solar panels to alleviate the cost of electricity.

Artist of the Month - Gloria Lee



Artist of the Month, Gloria Lee, has on display a large range of sewn items which are attracting a great deal of interest and many sales this month.

In Gloria's words:

I have always had an interest in sewing, having made most of my children's clothing in their younger years. About 17 years ago I decided to purchase an embroidery machine to pretty-up my towels and clothes.

It did not take long for me to realise that I would need to sell some of my work if I wanted to keep sewing. I began by doing markets every weekend but after three-and-a-half years I was accepted as an exhibitor at Ferry Park Gallery where my Australian items are a great hit.

My work is also available at the Maclean Scottish Town Shop where visitors are looking for that little bit of Scotland.

In this gallery display, my large variety of items include the regular towels and washer sets (both baby and adult), tea towels, kitchen towels, golf and bowls towels and pillow cases.

8x8 Small Works for 2023 – 'Small Wonders'


Canvases and forms are now on the front counter in readiness for sales, sales! Before we had finished setting up, two had already gone home with an enthusiastic owner.
