IMPORTANT REMINDERS!

Several concerning matters have been brought to the attention of the administration in recent weeks. Please, members, pay particular attention to the following:

- Once again PLEASE check that all doors are closed before leaving the Gallery. Each time doors are left open, the alarm is activated when someone enters, security ring us and someone has to go to Gallery to close them.
- AIR-CONDITIONERS: Just because we now have solar power, it does not mean we can afford to abuse our use of the air-conditioners. Please keep the front doors closed if the air-cons are on. Otherwise, use them judiciously so that power isn't wasted. Make sure ALL are turned off at the end of the day.
- CUSTOMER SERVICE those on duty are reminded that one person should be at the desk at all times to welcome visitors and for security reasons. Welcoming visitors to our gallery is an important part of customer service. Polite, friendly attention to our visitors and their needs will have them returning happily. Remember, we ARE NOT an essential service. We need them more than they need us.
- Policy on photography in Gallery: Photography is permitted in the gallery except if an individual exhibitor does not wish to have their work photographed. A motion at the meeting was passed permitting photography in the gallery. Should you not wish for your work to be photographed, you may display a small authorised sign with your work stating this. A REMINDER that most of us have had some of our work on Facebook and Instagram!
- EFTPOS AGAIN. Some of us are still not checking that Eftpos sales are APPROVED on the machine. Circle the amount and APPROVED on the slip, AND SIGN IT, before you let the customer walk out the door with the goods, please.
