You provided valid and thoughtful input and good questions around the concept of signing a 'non binding agreement' with CVC. Your collective thoughts were presented at a meeting with Katee Blizzard and Jacqui McLeod, from CVC Tourism and Industry, three members of the Port of Yamba Historical Society and three of our executive. The members of the Museum executive had similar concerns to ours and Katee is pursuing some further research on the legal implications of the Agreement.

I will keep you informed about further developments. The conversation is ongoing. There is also a CVC Visitors Guide proposal, to be published once every two years, and we are interested in buying advertising space in this publication.

Artist of the Month: Michelle Philip: Geckos New Tail

Lestablished Geckos New Tail in 2014.

Recycling my mother's tea towels into sunhats is how I started – using pieces that provoked nostalgia for a time less hectic. Geckos new tail has grown over the last 10 years and designs range from blanket hoodies to vintage pattern dresses made from vintage fabric and prints to honor the era the dress came from.

I'm also influenced by my working travels in Japan in the snow industry, often returning with vintage kimonos and Japanese print fabric. I blend this with my love of indigo dyeing using shibori dyeing techniques learnt whilst at university and rekindled after a workshop with Kerrie Bowles at Cowper Gallery in 2021.

All pieces are one-off creations and no two are the same. Hats vary in styles from slouch caps, train drivers' caps, to sunhats and bucket hats. All are reversible and practise wearable art. Dresses and jumpsuits are made in various sizes and styles. Most of the time the fabric dictates the design.

Call in and explore Michelle's innovative work. There's something there for everyone.
