**Kim McKenna** began her journey into leatherwork in the late '70s, stamping patterns on belts and bags for a local family business.

After leaving the area she started producing her own works and sold around shows and rodeos, eventually returning to the Clarence Valley where it had all started. Having converted an old dairy into her workshop, she became an exhibitor at Ferry Park Gallery a little over a decade ago.

These days while still making belts and bags she also creates beautiful picture carvings as well as bespoke works.

Tina is a self-confessed Jill of all trades, master of nothing.
