# 8x8 Small Works Exhibition 2025: "The Source"

Canvases for the 8x8 have been ordered, delivered and are on the counter ready for sale. The 8x8 Small Works Exhibition will be held as a precursor to The Plunge Festival next year, with the exhibition running from **Saturday 29th March to Sunday 4th May 2025.** Please make yourself familiar with the receipting process.

Entries close and works are to be delivered two weeks beforehand (4pm Friday, March 15<sup>th</sup>).

Announcement of winners and presentation of prizes to be held at 6 pm on Friday, March 29th (Adults) and 2pm, Saturday, March 30<sup>th</sup> (Youth).

Collection of unsold works on Monday, May 5<sup>th</sup>.

Last year we did cover costs – but only just – so In an effort to make this year more viable, entry fees have been increased by \$15 (Adults) and \$10 (Youth), prizes to be the same as last year. Estimating the sale of works to be similar to last year, this should give us some additional funds to play with.
